March 17th 2019 - 2nd Sunday of Lent

Well what can I say? What can you say? What can any of us say?

For nearly forty years, I have been writing a "message" on the front page of parish bulletins, starting in St. Mary's, Altona in 1981, followed by Ivanhoe, Mitcham, then Geelong, and now St. Simon's. Most weeks they are a commentary (hopefully some sort of "Christian" commentary) on a current news item. Like many "editorials", they are usually unsigned - but parishioners certainly know that I am the writer.

But from time to time, like this week (and last week), I'll place my name at the end of the message, because what is written is more, well, personal.

In the bulletins for the past two weekends, I have tried to find some words of meaning within the dark reality that has saturated our media - print and electronic. "Meaning", not so much "comfort" - even though "comfort" is what we would like to have. "Comfort" is feeling things might not be as bad as they seem, and to be convinced that it will hopefully be so much better tomorrow or the next day.

But "meaning" is different. It's not warm and fuzzy - but it's very rational, and might help us work our way through what has probably been the most disconcerting and troublesome challenge to our Catholic Faith we could ever have imagined (or more likely, never have imagined!).

Shame, sadness, anger, disillusion are all words that have been used to describe the myriad of emotions and reactions over the past two weeks, the varying perspectives notwithstanding.

Just tonight (Thursday) I have spent an hour on the phone with a remarkable man who has suffered for forty years as a result of his abuse. Yet over that tortuous journey, he has eventually returned to his faith in Jesus and to the Gospel to which he was so strongly committed until both were brutally wrenched away from him at thirteen years of age.

Yet today he is a man of faith. He speaks of Jesus constantly. He makes his day-to-day decisions by genuinely asking "What would Jesus do?". And as best he can, he follows up with the answer to that question. His faith commitment is church-connected. Unsurprisingly, however, his church today is not the Catholic church of his upbringing.

Many who have suffered as he has cannot readily find the person of Jesus in their life, let alone in the Church. But some have, and amazingly it is they who can be a shining light of encouragement for the many, many people who are struggling with their Church (and for many the Faith) at this time.

"Jesus, give me the strength to follow you" is a simple prayer that can be prayed in many other words - but with the same meaning.



Frankie Valli and the Four Seasons said it well more than fifty years ago:

> "Let's hang on to what we've got, don't let go now, we've got a lot. Got a lot of faith between us, so hang on, hang on, hang on to what we've got! "

First reading

Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

Taking Abram outside, the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can.' 'Such will be your descendants,' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified.

'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord,' Abram replied 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Birds of prey came down on the carcases but Abram drove them off.

When the sun had set and darkness had fallen, there appeared a smoking furnace and a firebrand that went between the halves. That day the Lord made a Covenant with Abram in these terms:

'To your descendants I give this land,

from the wadi of Egypt to the Great River.'

Second reading

Philippians 3:17-4:1

My brothers, be united in following my rule of life. Take as your models everybody who is already doing this and study them as you used to study us. I have told you often, and I repeat it today with tears, there are many who are behaving as the enemies of the cross of Christ. They are destined to be lost. They make foods into their god and they are proudest of something they ought to think shameful; the things they think important are earthly things. For us, our homeland is in heaven, and from heaven comes the saviour we are waiting for, the Lord Jesus Christ, and he will transfigure these wretched


bodies of ours into copies of his glorious body. He will do that by the same power with which he can subdue the whole universe.

So then, my brothers and dear friends, do not give way but remain faithful in the Lord. I miss you very much, dear friends; you are my joy and my crown.

Gospel

Luke 9:28-36

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up the mountain to pray. As he prayed, the aspect of his face was changed and his clothing became brilliant as lightning. Suddenly there were two men there talking to him; they were Moses and Elijah appearing in glory, and they were speaking of his passing which he was to accomplish in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were heavy with sleep, but they kept awake and saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As these were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' - He did not know what he was saying. As he spoke, a cloud came and covered them with shadow; and when they went into the cloud the disciples were afraid. And a voice came from the cloud saying, 'This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to him.' And after the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. The disciples kept silence and, at that time, told no one what they had seen.
